The seminar will look at which energy statistics are available for the UK, where energy is consumed, and address how important transport energy use is in greater detail. Following on from a very interesting talk about aviation emissions last year we will have a short presentation on the often overlooked but vitally important area of shipping and its demand for energy, how statistics on shipping usage are collected and how the sector can be made greener. We also plan to have a short panel session at the end.

Speakers

Energy Statistics, Warren Evans, Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy

The Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy publishes an annual Digest of UK Energy Statistics (DUKES). Last summer, BEIS published the 70th edition of DUKES making it one of the longer running statistical publications in government. The presentation will trace changes in energy production and use over the last seventy years, with a focus on consumption for electricity generation and transport over the last ten years.

Warren Evans is a Senior Energy Statistician at BEIS.

An Overview of New Sources of Sustainable Energy, Speaker t.b.c.

What are the possible new sources of energy? Are they sustainable and will they reduce our carbon footprint? What do they cost now and are costs likely to come down? There are any numbers of issues with the various suggested new sources of energy. The second half of the seminar will critically analyse the sources of energy that we are likely to be using in the future, both generally and for transport in particular.

This will be followed by a panel discussion on energy statistics.
